Substantially Complete!

It has been four months since we initially announced that we were embarking on the much-needed replacement of our Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) system. During that time, our community has endured unseasonable extremes in temperature, the presence of portable air-conditioning units throughout the building, clutter, dust, noise, and periodic suspension in our usual program offerings and activities. Westchester Public Library thanks all our patrons for your patience with us over the past several months. Your generous, understanding attitude has made the entire process much easier. That said, you will be thrilled to learn (and we are *extremely* excited to announce) that the HVAC replacement project has reached an important milestone: **substantial completion!**

Our previous HVAC system dated back to 1965 when the building was first constructed. The most recent enhancements were done over 25 years ago, in 1993, when we added the wing facing Canterbury Street along with our elevator system. Over the years and decades, the previous HVAC system gradually became unreliable and inefficient making it increasingly difficult to maintain consistent, comfortable temperatures in our building. Needless to say, it was high time to replace it.

While this project took slightly longer than anticipated, we now have an HVAC system that is far superior and much more sophisticated than the old one, largely due to the addition of "direct digital control" automation. Direct digital control (DDC) offers many advantages. Due to its accuracy and fast response time, DDC offers increased occupant comfort. It also entails lower operating costs, and because operations can be programmed to

control equipment in a more optimized manner, far greater energy efficiency, as well. Perhaps best of all, DDC allows our staff administrators and maintenance personnel to spend less time addressing climate control issues and more time focusing on other ways in which we can make our facility a more comfortable, hospitable place.

Again, this project has reached the "substantially complete" stage. Among other things, this means that while we now enjoy full use of our building and have resumed regular Library operations and programs, there may, for a short time, be ongoing cosmetic touch-ups, such as drywall repair, painting, patching holes, etc. Above all, we want to remind our patrons that this project is part of an ongoing effort to improve our facility and help make the Westchester Library a more comfortable, enjoyable place. We thank you for your patience and understanding over the past several months, and invite you to stop in soon!

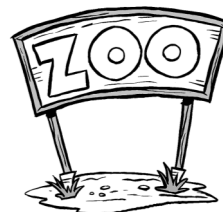

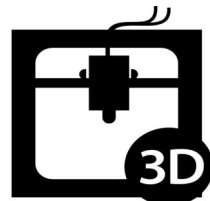
